

The OA Club is pleased to announce Dr Tim Nuttall (Espin 1978) as the 2025 President of the Old Andean Club in recognition of his meaningful service to St Andrew's College and contribution to the academic and educational space in South Africa.

Tim attended St Andrew's Prep from 1969 to 1973, and College from 1974 to 1978. He matriculated in 1977 and completed a Post Matric year in 1978. After leaving College, Tim studied at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, where he earned a BA Honours degree and a Higher Education Diploma. In 1982, he was awarded the prestigious Rhodes Scholarship to study at the University of Oxford. There, he completed a PPE Honours degree (Philosophy, Politics and Economics) and a DPhil in History.

From 1989 to 2001 Tim served as a lecturer and later as an Associate Professor at UKZN, where he contributed significantly to the academic community through teaching and research. He transitioned from academia to school leadership in 2002, when he joined the College staff by taking on the role of Senior Deputy Headmaster. During his years at SAC, he played a key role in the Jubilee 150th campaign, as well as the conception and publication of *The Boy in You*.

Tim left College in April 2009 to work as an education consultant, first on an international school project in Kenya and then with the Historic Schools Restoration Project in South Africa. From 2011 – 2013 he served as the Head of Somerset College Senior School in Somerset West. In August 2013 he became the Rector of St Stithians College in Johannesburg, a position he held for seven years. From 2020 – 2022 he took up the position of Director of Schools for Shrewsbury International Asia, overseeing four schools in Thailand and China.

Tim is married to Margie Shaw and they currently reside in Somerset West. They are parents to Joshua (Mullins 2011) and Lalage, both of whom were educated at Prep before moving on to attend College and DSG Junior respectively.

Tim is a devoted Old Andean whose contributions have made a lasting impact on our community. We look forward to a meaningful year with him as the 2025 President of the Old Andean Club.
